Learning Outcome

Historic Day

Students will develop their English language skills by exploring the historical significance of Broadstairs and Canterbury, using English to describe historical events, discuss local heritage, and engage with cultural narratives, thereby deepening their understanding of history in an English-

Art Day

Students will enhance their English language skills by visiting a gallery in London, using English to describe artworks, express opinions, and engage in discussions about different art styles and techniques, thereby expanding their vocabulary and confidence in discussing art and culture..

Literature Day

Students will improve their English language skills by exploring the literary heritage of Rochester and Broadstairs, with a focus on Charles Dickens, using English to discuss his works, describe key locations associated with his life, and engage in activities that enhance their understanding and appreciation of his literature and its historical context.

Nature and Reflection Day

Students will develop their English language skills by observing and discussing wildlife and natural features along the English coast, using appropriate vocabulary to describe their surroundings, express reflections on their experiences, and engage in conversations about nature and environmental awareness in an English-speaking context.

Science Day

Students will enhance their English language skills by exploring exhibits at the Natural History Museum and Science Museum, using English to describe scientific concepts, ask questions, and discuss discoveries, thereby broadening their scientific vocabulary and ability to communicate about science in an English-speaking environment.
